#### EASTER MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR

Dear People of God, lockdown is not a choice it is a must. So, I trust that all of you are looking after yourself and your families, and if needed, to care for neighbours. We are told that since World War 2 the global community has never experienced such tragedy and need to live under restrictions. But this is all for the common good. On this Day of Resurrection, we commend all who have died to eternal rest with God, we boldly pray for comfort for the bereaved, and courageously petition for healing and hope. I hope that all learners and students are applying themselves to reading, study and working through their curricula.
